# LEARNING TO READ, READING TO LEARN

At Balksbury Federation, we love to read. We are dedicated in our mission to ensure all children are given the gift of reading.

Children begin learning to read after only a few days at school, taking part in daily phonics lessons. During these lessons, children will being learning new sounds, putting them together to blend and read words. At Balksbury Federation, we follow the Little Wandle for Letters and Sounds scheme.

Children then have the opportunity to apply their learning, by bringing home a decodable reading book to read with you at home.

These books will match their developing phonic knowledge. We want the children to be able to read these books fluently, to develop their skills as a reader.

Children will also bring home an additional library book, which is changed each week. We do not expect children to be able to read these books independently. They are to share with you and to read together.



### SUPPORTING AT HOME

You can keep up with the sounds that your child is learning in class by checking their Google Classroom page. Each week, teachers will upload a sheet summarizing what has been taught in phonics lessons. You can use these sheets to talk to your child about their learning.







Reading at home is important. We recommend reading with your child every day. This does not mean reading their whole book! Reading a page of their decodable book together is enough, and will make a huge difference to their progress when learning to read. A bedtime story is also an excellent way to share new vocabulary with your child, as well as providing a lovely opportunity to spend time together.

Remember to record when you have read with your child in their reading diary. Let your child's class teacher know if there was anything that they need additional support with.
