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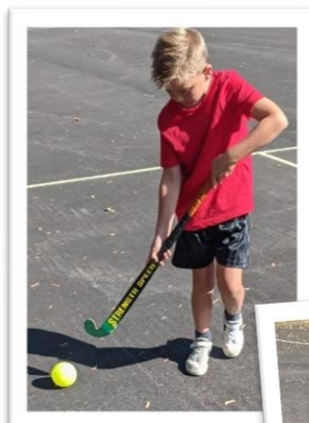
Classroom News

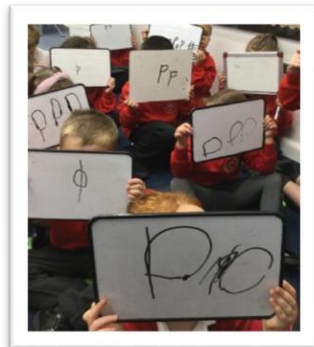


Year 3

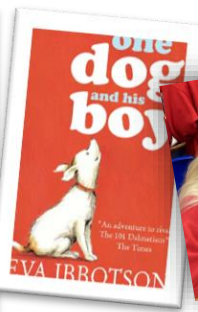
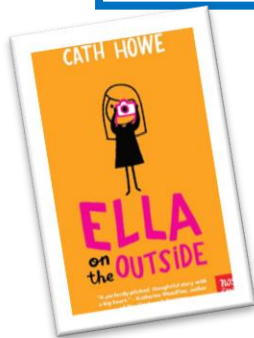
Spotlight Author

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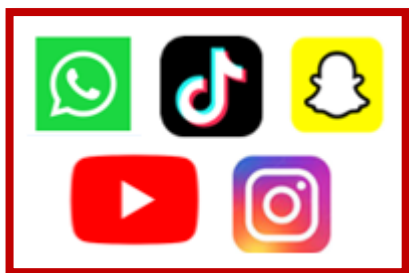
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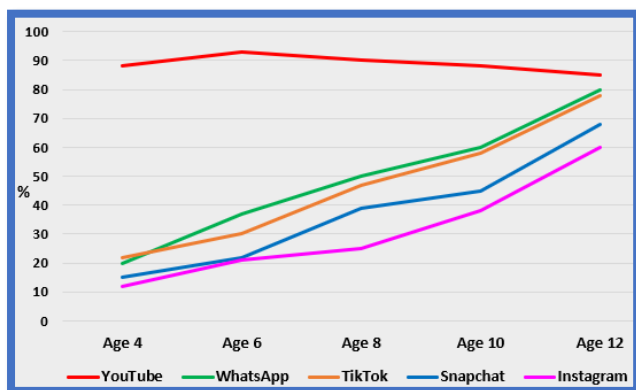
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ESafety

Which social media app is your child using?



In a recent survey, **85% of our children use at least one social media app/site** for connecting with friends, and engaging with others online.



Most use **YouTube** to watch videos.

Many use **TikTok** and **Instagram** to view or share photos and videos.

Many use **WhatsApp** or **Snapchat** to message friends.

BUT ...

You need to be 13+ to use these platforms.



What are the risks?

Content

Being exposed to illegal, harmful or inappropriate content.

Contact

Being exposed to harmful online interactions with other users.

Conduct

Online behaviour that increases the chances of, or causes harm;

Commerce

Risks such as online gambling, advertising, phishing and/or financial scams

TOP TIPS

- ♦ **Know what privacy features are available** - use privacy settings to stop unwanted contact from strangers
- ♦ **Review the location settings** - ensure the child's location can't be seen publicly
- ♦ **Check the age ratings and features** - most have a minimum age of 13+. Some apps will need parental consent
- ♦ **Talk to your child** - about what they are doing online and how they can be safe

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New Government Attendance Rules

What do they mean for families?

1

'I'm a parent and I want to take my child out of school for a full or half day – what do I need to do? Will it be authorised?'

You must fill out an absence request form. This form allows us to decide whether an absence is valid for authorisation based on The Department for Education's guidance. Holiday requests will not be authorised.



2

'If my absence request gets denied and I take my child out of school anyway, what will happen?'

If your child misses 5 school days, you will be given a penalty notice fine. The fine is **£80 per parent, per child** if you pay within 21 days. After 21 days the amount per parent, per child will double to **£160 per parent, per child**.



3

'What happens if I get a penalty notice and then my child continues to have unauthorised absences?'

If in any period of not more than 3 years, your child has a 2nd or 3rd leave of unauthorised absence, or a pattern of irregular attendance, the fines increase without any discount for early payment.



2nd time charges with 2 parents



- 1 child = **£320**
- 2 children = **£640**
- 3 children = **£960**
- 4 children = **£1280**



3rd time

This time, a penalty notice will not be given. Instead, your case will be taken forward for prosecution. A magistrate can fine each parent **£2,500 for each child**.

'What happens if the school suspect my child has been on holiday and no absence form has been completed?'

If you have phoned your child in sick, or have had their absence authorised and...

- Holiday photos from social media are brought to our attention
- We try to phone you and receive a foreign dial tone
- We conduct a home visit and you are not there

Your absence may be unauthorised.

'What about irregular attendance? Could I still be fined?'

If your child is absent (or late after 10 register closes) for more than **10 sessions in 10 weeks** and the absences are unauthorised, then according to the new guidance, you will be issued a penalty notice.

Remember, 1 day is 2 sessions (morning and afternoon).

'What are the typical reasons given that won't be authorised?'

- A family members birthday
- Shopping for uniform
- Child being used as a carer
- Issues with transport
- Sporting events
- Poor family organisation
- Visiting relatives abroad
- Family holidays
- Non-essential appointments
- Travelling before a weekend or authorised holiday



'Who do I speak to if I want more advice or information on attendance?'

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Governor Message

Who are you? - A Response to Last Year's Governor Survey

That's a great question! Who are Barksbury's governors? What do we do? And how do we do it?

Who are we?

Governors are volunteers who oversee the federation. I'm James Mirza-Davies, chair of Barksbury's governors. I first joined the Governing Body six years ago.

What do we do?

We oversee the federation's strategic leadership, while the Executive Headteacher and her Leadership Team implement the strategy, lead the federation and manage day-to-day operations. Our main responsibilities include:

1. Setting the federation's strategic direction
 2. Ensuring money is spent well
 3. Holding the headteacher to account
- Supporting the federation and its team is also a key part of our role.

How do we do it?

We meet every half-term as a group. Individually, we regularly visit the schools, each of us focussing on different areas. We also get a wider view of the federation, through exercises such as our annual governor survey.

In our next update, we'll share insights from our first meeting of the year, which took place this week.

Anxiety and Worry

Children can sometimes feel a little bit worried about going to school, but prolonged periods of absence are likely to make them worry more. Being in school with the support of their friends and teachers is likely to make them feel less worried than letting them stay at home.

Please speak to your child's teacher or the CSLs for support.

Conjunctivitis

Children may suffer with teary, red and itchy eyes. They can still attend school. Speak to a pharmacist if you are concerned for advice or treatment.

Aches

Children with headache, earache or stomach ache can go to school - just let the staff know they have felt unwell.

Give paracetamol and plenty of fluids to drink. School can administer paracetamol to Junior school children once a medical form has been completed.

Coughs and Colds

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

Children should be given paracetamol, plenty of fluids to drink and can be sent to school.



Sore Throats and Glandular Fever

Children should be given paracetamol, plenty of fluids to drink and be sent to school.

Glandular fever often associated with high temperature, sore throat (usually more painful than any before) and swollen glands. Your child needs to be well enough to concentrate at school.

High Temperature

A normal temperature in babies and children can vary slightly from child to child.

A high temperature is 38c or more.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. **They can go back to school or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.**

Diarrhoea and Vomiting

Ensure good hand hygiene.

Children can return to school 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.

Chicken Pox

Cases of chicken pox are generally infectious from 2 days before the rash appears to 5 days after the onset of the rash.

Although the usual exclusion period is 5 days, all lesions should be crusted over before children return to school.
