# Year 4

Year 4 have had such an excellent start to this academic year. In Science we have been learning how we classify living things - both animals and plants. We used simple closed questions about the characteristics of living things to group them using classification keys. When discussing plants, we went for a walk around our school grounds looking at the differences between deciduous evergreen trees. In **Design and Technology**, we have enjoyed our unit on biscuits so far and had fun practising skills like sieving, rolling and cutting. We loved tasting and evaluating existing biscuits even more and we also talked about the packaging and their target audiences. We cannot wait to make our own! In English, everyone has been working so hard on their Land of Neverbelieve scientific journals and we cannot wait to read them when they are finished.













# Year 5

What an amazing start to Year 5 we have made! We have used the VRs to visit the **mountains** and we have been able to virtually climb Mount Everest such a great experience! In Science, we have been learning all about forces and have carried out lots of practical investigations to learn more about how forces affect us. To investigate the effects of air resistance, we made three different size **parachutes** and attached them to a teddy, we then dropped them from the windows upstairs, it was interesting to see that the larger parachutes took longer to fall - the poor teddy attached to the parachute!

ESafety WhatsApp



WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries.

All you need to set up a WhatsApp account is a phone number

# What are the risks?

#### **Inappropriate content**

With end-to-end encryption, content cannot be monitored. Your child could see or hear harmful or upsetting content

#### Location sharing

Your child could reveal this to anyone they are chatting to

#### Unwanted contact

Children are at risk of receiving unwanted messages or calls from others

#### **Oversharing**

Privacy features may mean children feel safe to reveal private information or images. However, there is always a risk that an unintended person might see what they have sent

#### Group chats

Anyone in the group, even if they are not in your contacts, will see messages that you post, and you will see theirs. If you are added to a group with someone you have blocked, that person will still be able to contact you in the group chat

#### Edited messages

Messages can be edited up to 15mins after they have been sent. This could mean, a child could send a hurtful message and quickly edit it afterwards (and avoid repercussions)

#### Cyberbullying

The 'admin' can change - the name of the group, who can send messages, who can invite and remove people from the chat. This could lead to children feeling left out or being deliberately excluded or removed from groups


# Top Tips to keep your child safe

1. Check the privacy settings The default setting is 'Everyone'. Checking the privacy settings helps

you control who can see your child's information (profile, status, last seen)



Blocking a contact means that person will not be able to see the profile information or contact your child



Talk to your child regularly about what they should and shouldn't share with others on WhatsApp. Remind them that, even if they think what they are sending will stay private, others might save, forward or screenshot it.

4. Set rules about location sharing Decide with your child if it is appropriate for them to share their location with others and who they are allowed to

share it with. You can disable location permissions by going into your device settings and switching off location services for WhatsApp

During the meeting, we also covered and discussed key areas such as safeguarding, received updates from Miss Thompson about the federation, and looked over the School Improvement Plan.

All of this was accomplished in just under two hours! I'm excited to continue being part of the Balksbury community as a Governor. I look forward to my first Governor visit next week.

#### What is Big Sister Project?

The programme helps girls aged 9-15 feel 'sport ready' by recruiting a network of 'big sisters' – peer leaders and supporters from sport, school and community organisations. Sport leaders will be trained on the emotional and physical barriers girls face.

As part of their commitment to helping girls get into activity Places Leisure are offering a **free** membership to girls who meet the eligibility criteria\*, or a **50% discounted membership** for all other girls, which includes:


We have had a busy few weeks with our treat and **pre-loved uniform** sales. Thank you so much for your support!

At this age group, the children are now engaging in full contact rugby and learning the skills necessary to take forward towards the more advanced game in later years.


