Parking


Thank you to all of our families travelling by car who are adhering to local parking rules.

Year 1

Year 1 have been enjoying building relationships and working on team building skills. We have had great fun pretending to be frogs with lily pads (hoops) collaborating to get across the pond (playground).

Based on the text 'Tree' by Patricia Hegarty, we explored the concept of seasons by experiencing what it is like in each one. In winter we found snowflakes, fluffy socks and hot water bottles. Whilst in autumn, we found pine cones, seeds and a variety of dried leaves in a range of autumnal colours.











We've had a fantastic start in Year 2! We were extremely lucky to have OpenBox in the first week to support with our understanding of 'The Great Fire of London'. The children were plunged back into 1666 to get a sense of what London was like as a city, how such a big event could have started and how it spread so easily. In P.E. we have been focusing on team building activities. This has allowed children to solve problems and collaborate as а team whilst communicating with each other to achieve the same outcome. It has been wonderful seeing all the children interact and support one another.

Our Year 5/6 team continued to dominate with a 9-0 victory over a local school. I am pleased to announce that this year we are looking to encourage and develop the growth of girls' participation in sport, which has already kicked off in our netball team winning their first two fixtures and the girls football team drawing their first game of the season. I look forward to watching the children participate in future events and being given the opportunity to represent the school.



Building upon our new sports active break and lunch times initiative, we have introduced a range of new activities to inspire our culture of keeping fit, working collaboratively and having fun. Of the new activities, we have introduced trampettes for those budding gymnasts, rugby conversion kicking to go alongside our brand-new rugby posts as well as castle ball which is a new innovative way to promote teamwork and allows children to show perseverance whilst having fun.

During our weekly staff meetings, the staff have spoken positively about the impact of their P.E. lessons and have shared ideas to support the elevation of physical education across the federation. The understanding of the fundamental movements/ball skills that the children develop in the infant school and how that supports the children's learning of invasion games such as netball, football, rugby and hockey has been a topic of conversation between members of staff so that they understand how the work in each school develops the children's love of learning.





Touring parents who have come to visit the school as a prospective place for their child, have given positive feedback regarding P.E. lessons they have seen during their tour. These range from noticing the engagement of the children taking part, their abilities and skills, and their natural enthusiasm being shown. The children should be proud to receive such lovely feedback and I know that the staff are proud of the children for their efforts and dedication.

ESafetyWhatsApp



WhatsApp is one of the most popular instant messaging apps, used by over 2 billion people in 180 countries.

All you need to set up a WhatsApp account is a phone number

What are the risks?

Inappropriate content

With end-to-end encryption, content cannot be monitored. Your child could see or hear harmful or upsetting content

Unwanted contact

Children are at risk of receiving unwanted messages or calls from others

Location sharing

Your child could reveal this to anyone they are chatting to

Oversharing

Privacy features may mean children feel safe to reveal private information or images. However, there is always a risk that an unintended person might see what they have sent

Cyberbullying

The 'admin' can change - the name of the group, who can send messages, who can invite and remove people from the chat. This could lead to children feeling left out or being deliberately excluded or removed from groups

Group chats

Anyone in the group, even if they are not in your contacts, will see messages that you post, and you will see theirs. If you are added to a group with someone you have blocked, that person will still be able to contact you in the group chat

Edited messages

Messages can be edited up to 15mins after they have been sent. This could mean, a child could send a hurtful message and quickly edit it afterwards (and avoid repercussions)

Top Tips to keep your child safe

1. Check the privacy settings

The default setting is 'Everyone'.

Checking the privacy settings helps
you control who can see your child's
information (profile, status, last seen etc.)

- 2. Show how to block contacts or report inappropriate content

 Blocking a contact means they will not be able to see the profile information or contact your child
- 3. Talk about sharing information

 Talk to your child regularly about what they should and shouldn't share with others on WhatsApp. Remind them that, even if they think what they are sending will stay private, others might save, forward or screenshot it
- 4. Set rules about location sharing
 Decide with your child if it is appropriate for them to share their location with others and who they are allowed to share it with. You can disable location permissions by going into your device settings and switching off location services for WhatsApp

Governor Message

Yummilicious!

I was delighted to be invited into the Junior school to conduct a food visit with the Miss Bolton. I met with four children from Year 2 and Year 5 who were able to tell me all about how food permeates through the curriculum. They were able to tell me all about healthy eating, how to grow food, the importance of handwashing, and the impact of allergies. They described in detail the many projects that they have been involved with at Balksbury Federation such as making use of the poly tunnel, and the different cultural food experiences they have had had which are embedded in the curriculum from Year R to Year 6, as well as the highly sought after Cooking Club after school, and their involvement in designing the Change4 Life posters across the Federation. It was also positive to hear about the array of cooking books available to the children in the library so they can become more involved in meal preparation at home.

We also discussed the move to Dolce, and how this has been positively received by the children. All the children especially enjoy the picnic lunches in the summer months. One child I spoke to told me that he had enjoyed his meal so much that he requested his parent make it at home, which is easy to do as the recipes are readily available via School Grid. Dolce have been incredibly responsive to feedback, and they have been conducting regular surveys with the pupils to ascertain favourite meals.

I was able to also observe (to my surprise) a very calm and orderly lunchtime, no food throwing was in sight! I saw firsthand the encouragement offered by staff to those

who were slightly too eager to dash off to the playground without finishing their food. I was also surprised to see that all the children were able to clear away their plates and remember to use the new recycling bins which were recently introduced by the Climate ActionTeam.

I have to say, as a foodie, I was genuinely pleasantly surprised by the pasta dish I ate.....long gone are the beige fried foods and sponge with pink custard!!!

This visit enabled me to see how Balksbury Federation embed food into their curriculum across the year groups and demonstrated that the children are readily able to share their experiences and learning. It also highlighted the positive impact that Dolce have had within the school community.

My last question: when can I come back for more?!

Well done Mason for demonstrating Balksbury's value of perseverance. We are so impressed with your creation.




